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GENERAL FFA RULES

1. Entries open to any Ag Ed student in either the East Holmes or West Holmes School District and Holmes Co. residents of Waynedale.
2. Entries open to any young farmer student under 19 years of age (on January 1) enrolled in systematic instructions in Ag Ed, or who maintain their membership in FFA and continue with the development of their farming programs under direct supervision of the local Ag Ed teachers.
3. All exhibits must be from projects regularly elected and conducted by the exhibitor. All animals exhibited must have been actually owned and cared for by the individual exhibitor.
4. All projects must be completed since the previous year's fair.
5. All animal(s) must follow guidelines for exhibition adopted by the Sr. Fair Board in this Fair book.

DIVISION - BOOTH

1. The display booth will be about 6' wide in front tapering to 4' wide in the back with a depth of 4'. All booths will be single and will be separated by partitions. They may be repainted using official FFA colors.
2. Exhibits shall feature educational values and accomplishments of the FFA for the benefit of the general public. The exhibit shall present a single area of the FFA Chapter's activities. The areas of activities are Farming Programs, Leadership, Cooperation, Community Service Conservation, Earnings and Savings, Scholarships, Safety and Agriculture Occupations.
3. Exhibits will be judged on the following basis:
 - A. Power to Attract Attention, catch the eye.
 1. Presents an original, appealing, attractive display.
 2. Uses models, life, motion, color or lights to attract the attention of the public to the booth.
 - B. Power to Arouse and Hold Interest.
 1. Informs the public concerning the achievements of the FFA.
 2. Deals with significant and important thoughts of the viewers. It creates suspense and arouses their curiosity and interests.
 - C. Adequate development of the Message or Theme.
 1. Develops one central idea so that it is clearly and readily understood.
 2. Shows a specific chapter activity or accomplishment. (Failure to comply will deduct 20 points).
 3. Presents an uncluttered appearance that does not detract from the theme.

**FCCLA INDIVIDUAL PROJECT EXHIBITS**

1. Project must be those completed as action projects for a family and consumer science program in Holmes County. Individual projects will be displayed in Homes Arts Building.
2. All projects must be completed since the previous year's fair and be the work of the exhibitor.
3. If the project cannot be displayed at the fair (meals, room redecorating, etc.), student will display a poster illustrating project. Actual project will be judged but not displayed.
4. Categories are:
 - A. Personal development
 - B. Resource management
 - C. Nutrition and Wellness
 - D. Life planning
 - E. Family relations
 - F. Parenting

FCCLA BOOTH RULES

1. The booth shall be of appropriate size to effectively exhibit the display.
2. Exhibits shall be educational in nature in either of the two categories listed below:
 - A. The exhibit can represent any phase of the six subject areas of family and consumer sciences: personal development, resource management, nutrition and wellness, life planning, family relations, and parenting.
 - B. The exhibit shall feature educational values and accomplishments of the FCCLA. These accomplishments can be in the area of educational, leadership, cooperation, community service, history or other areas of projects completed by the FCCLA chapter.
